For years, Atlanta property manager Clayton Edwards felt compelled to integrate his faith and work. Then, when the world shut down in 2020, he decided he had to get to know his residents on a deeper level.

Aiming to do what Jesus would do, Clayton created spaces where people would find love, purpose, and belonging. He hired a missionary, a social worker, and a chef to serve residents and show them Christ's love.

But what you may not know is their unwavering commitment to generosity. Jeff and his wife, Sue, raised their kids with such a spirit of giving that it was natural for the entire family to embrace the idea of using their successful business as an engine to fuel charitable goals.

With the help of their advisors and NCF, the Rutts gave non-voting stock in their company to NCF, and the net proceeds supported




the charities they love. They held a signing ceremony (above) as a declaration of their release of the family business to God.

Funding the Great Commission

At the heart of all we do at NCF is the gospel, the good news of Jesus Christ that we are compelled to share with a broken world.

Each year, NCF givers make the spread of God's Word their highest priority.

They fund their local churches, college campus ministries, and international parachurch organizations reaching every corner of the world.

Our team at NCF marvels at the generosity of so many individuals and families who

provided unprecedented resources to fulfill the Great Commission. Here are some highlights:

- Evangelism: \$151M
- Children's ministry: \$76M
- Discipleship: \$74M
- Student ministry: \$42M
- Church planting: \$26M
- Apologetics: \$12M

In 2023, almost a quarter of all NCF grants to charities – 23% – supported ministries dedicated to local and global missions.

With two million incarcerated people in the U.S. and another five million struggling to thrive post-release, one in two Americans has an immediate family member who has been incarcerated.


With the net proceeds from the sale of the gifted real estate, the Mullens experienced a new world of joyful giving and sent more to their favorite ministries than they ever thought they could.
